WELLNESS UPDATE

- Nutrition Services Update
 - Grant to release more share carts has been received
 - Share Table creates a space for students to place their unwanted food items for other students to take as a way to reduce waste.
 - Partnering with the Green Team to get the share carts started at the elementary schools
 - Nutrition services is going to try and add a vegetarian pizza to the menu
 - Partnered with Deeply Rooted local company that supplies vegetarian/plant based sausage
 - Emoji based survey platform for the high school students
 - On an iPad on a stand that the students can give their feedback as they finish their meal
- Safe Routes to School Update
 - Bike education
 - Applying for 10-year safe routes to schools plan grant from Department of Transportation
 - Helpful to have a long-term plan to apply for other grants
 - o Potential improvements on the roadway by RDLS and 73rd
 - Infrastructure needs at Sheridan hills, HS, and MS that would like to be addressed
- Wellness Committee Update
 - Frosty four campaign from Hennepin County
 - Want to get this out in about February and March
 - Campaign is to learn and think more about our personal wellness
 - Monthly benefits newsletter about various wellness items

HEALTH & SAFETY UPDATE

- Radon Testing January 6-7 and January 9-10
 - Overview: Radon is a naturally occurring gas from the ground that can come through the cracks in the foundation and is a known carcinogen. It is recommended to test school buildings every 5 years to ensure that radon concentrations are below 4 picocuries per liter.
 - Testing will occur in all occupied spaces below or at ground level and 10% of upper rooms.
 - Test kits will be hung on the walls of occupied spaces.
 - Any tested spaces that have results above 4 picocuries per liter are then retested with a continuous radon monitor that provides hourly radon concentrations.
 - The last round of testing was conducted in 2019, and no areas sampled exceeded 4 picocuries per liter.
- CPR/First Aid/AED Training for Facilities Staff December 27
 - 3 staff members signed up, need 5 people total to host the course

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- Course consists of an online session followed by hands on training
- Noise Monitoring Project occurring January 14, 21, 23, and 24
 - Noise monitoring is used to determine who is required to be a part of the Hearing Conservation Program
 - Employees who are exposed to an average of 85 decibels or above during an 8 hour period exceed the OSHA threshold and should be provided hearing protection and annual audiograms
 - Departments included are music, industrial technology, grounds, maintenance, and transportation.
- Chainsaw Safety Training
 - o IEA hosted a chainsaw safety training course held at Shakopee Public Schools.
 - o Ethan Thompson, new grounds lead, attended the training
 - Training consisted of 1.5 hours of classroom training followed by a hands on tree cutting session
- Science Lab, Eyewash, and Fume Hood Inspections
 - o Inspections were conducted in early November by IEA
 - o These annual inspections are required by OSHA and the MN State Fire Code
 - o IEA works with Facilities and Chemical Hygiene Officers following the inspection
- Hennepin County Hazardous Waste Report (Due 12/15)
 - Hennepin County requires all organizations with a hazardous waste license to report the amount of waste that is generated
 - This is due annually on December 15 and has been submitted
- Indoor Air Quality Walkthrough Dates February 10-14
 - Walkthroughs are a proactive measure to monitor the air quality in classrooms and offices and identify early signs of moisture accumulation or HVAC issues
 - An IEA technician will be on site with a monitoring device that measures carbon dioxide, carbon monoxide, temperature, and relative humidity.
- Indoor Air Quality Staff Survey
 - This survey is sent out prior to the walkthrough to give staff an opportunity to share their concerns
 - Submissions are sent to IEA to help identify areas of concern to staff during the walkthrough

FACILITIES UPDATE

- Fall/Winter Projects Overview
 - The MN state patrol is at the bus garage to do bus inspections
 - December 5 and December 12
 - o Electric vehicle school bus grant from Minnesota Department of Commerce

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- Applying to get 2 electric busses to see if the district can get approved for it
- There are other costs involved that are not a part of the grant
- Challenges and additional costs with maintaining a power supply for electric busses must be addressed as well
- SFM Signs Winter Safety
 - SFM provided signs and Richfield will continue to change signs regularly throughout the winter
